**Leadership Team** - Mrs Pickford, Mrs Butcher and Mrs Beecroft-Sullivan work across both Wimbish Primary Academy and Meadow Primary School. There may be times you wish to speak to one particular member of the team and they are not at Wimbish that day. In that instance, please do feel free to ask to speak to another leader. If they are available, they will happily meet with you. Alternatively, please pop to the office or drop an email to the office and Ms White, will make sure that message gets passed on. Please remember that the Academy policy is that communications will be acknowledged within 2 working days and responded to in more detail, if needed within 5 working days.

We would ask that in the first instance, you speak with the class teacher if you wish to discuss a concern or query about your child as they will be best placed to respond. If you then wish to speak to a senior leader, please contact the school office.

#### **Attendance**

Children's regular attendance in school is incredibly important. 1 day off can mean your child has missed a lot of learning and every single day counts. A school day counts for 2 sessions. At this point in the year each session missed equates to a high percentage of absence and just 6 sessions off school (3 days) will give your child an attendance of below 80%.

The Government requirement is for all children to have attendance of 95% or higher. If your child's attendance falls below 90% then they will become categorised as persistently absent and this may trigger an absence meeting, a support plan or involvement from the Local Authority's Education Welfare Officer. Poor attendance can also lead to parents/carers being given a penalty fine or taken to court by the Local Authority and fined or prosecuted.

We do send out letters to inform parents/carers when we have concerns about attendance falling. You can also keep an eye on attendance on the MCAS app.

We fully understand that children catch childhood ailments such as chicken pox, sickness bugs, fevers and such like. However, if your child just feels a little unwell, tired, a bit of a cold or cough or similar then they should be in school. We will always call you if we are concerned about their health.

# Should your child stay off school?

Sickness/diarrhoea - return 48 hours after last bout of illness

Temperature - return to school when it has gone back down

Chicken Pox - return after spots have crusted over (usually around 5 days)

Impetigo - stay off until scabbed over or 48hrs after starting antibiotics

Ringworm - return after started treatment

Scarlet Fever - return 24 hours after starting antibiotics - please inform school

Head Lice - can be at school but advise treatment first

Threadworms - no need to stay off, but please seek treatment from pharmacist

Sore throat - no need to stay off unless they have a temperature

Slapped Cheek - child can come to school as once the rash is out they are not infectious. Please inform school

Hand, Foot and Mouth - can attend school. Good hand hygiene is needed

Ear Infection - if this is severe earache or a temperature stay off until better or temperature has gone down

Covid- 19 - try to stay at home for 3 days after they tested positive

Cold Sores - no need to stay off, but hygiene routines are important

Coughs and Colds - it is fine to send children in with a minor cough or common cold. If they have a fever keep them off until this returns to normal

Conjunctivitis - can be at school. Hygiene routines are important

The NHS website has more detail on all of the above illnesses.

### **School Lunch Order**

Thank you to everyone who has been using the Innovate platform to order school meals. Lunch orders need to be placed by midnight on a Saturday for the following week. Innovate's policy if you have not ordered a meal, but your child does not have a packed lunch is we will call you to ask for a lunch to be brought in. Any child without a lunch will be given a jacket potato. Just a reminder that we cannot place late orders for you.

#### Homework

We are currently revising our homework policy. In the interim, we would encourage you to hear your child read (including KS2 children) on a daily basis as we want every child to leave Wimbish a confident reader. Please also talk about their book. KS2 children should also focus on VIPERS. There are six key reading skills which relate to the KS2 Reading SAT Content Domains. These skills are known as VIPERS (Vocabulary, Infer, Predict, Explain, Retrieve, Summarise).
