Staffing Update

I am delighted to say that as of Monday 9th October, Miss Harding will be joining us as a Teaching Assistant. Miss Harding is an experienced Level 3 childcare practitioner and she will predominantly be working with Oak Class. She will also run one of our breakfast club sessions and an after school session. We are now fully staffed at Wimbish, with a superb and enthusiastic team who are working incredibly hard to put routines, boundaries and consistency in place as part of our fresh start at Wimbish.

Reminder - Bedtime Story and Welcome Meeting - all pupils

We would like to invite you all to our first Welcome Meeting and Bedtime Story session on Wednesday 11th October 5.30pm-6.30pm. Children are invited to wear their pyjamas for their bedtime story. We will start the evening in the hall to introduce the team. You will then be welcome to have a wander around the classrooms and see where your child's classroom is. We will then invite parents/carers back to the hall while the children stay in their classrooms and have bedtime stories and some hot chocolate. We will then share updates on the behaviour policy and information about school with parents/carers in the hall.

I am delighted to say we are starting to book some enrichment opportunities in for the children to broaden their experiences. On Tuesday 31st October we have Essex County Cricket Club working with us for the day. They will be providing workshops and activities for all children across the day. This experience is linked into the upcoming Cricket World Cup and is a free experience with no cost to school or families.

On November 10th, all children will participate in a free dance session with The Lane Academy.

We also have won a grant to have the Royal Scientific Institute to come and spend a whole day in school delivering exciting workshops linked to the science curriculum. They will also run a staff training session and a parent/carer and child session - more details to follow once confirmed.

Just a reminder...Autumn Term Reading Homework

Dear Parents/Carers,

Here is the Reading Homework: **Autumn Book Bingo** for this term based on our whole school focus for this year: Reading and more specifically: Reading for Pleasure.

Every child, from Foundation to Year 6, has been given the same homework to make it more manageable for families and also the homework will be differentiated depending on the age of each child and their book choice.

We know that parents/carers and pupils, have different views on homework so you can choose how you want to approach it. Here are some options:

- 1. Try to read all 9 texts (which can be found in our school library, local library, online potentially and possibly on your own bookshelves at home) and tick each of the 9 boxes
- 2. Complete option a and complete the questions. Give your answers to Mrs Butcher and they will be displayed in the library.

- 3. Can you create your own Book Bingo grid and read 9 different books based on WINTER?
- 4. Create a book review for ONE or more of the 9 books you have read which will be displayed in the library
- 5. Take photographs as evidence to show you have completed reading these books. For example: a photo of your seasonal treat that you have made after reading and following a recipe
- 6. Start reading a spooky story and then stop reading, write what you think will happen next in the story and then carry on reading- which ending did you prefer and why?
- 7. After reading an autumnal poem/s and reciting it/ them, can you create your own autumnal poem after going on an autumnal walk and using all 5 senses ...

Please give all NAMED written work to Mrs Butcher who will display it in the library.
